The New Forest Chapter 319 was formed in 1904, one of several Masonic groups that meets at Lymington's Masonic Hall, the first purpose-built Masonic Hall in the area. The venue is used not just for Masonic activities but also for local community and private events such as art exhibitions and wedding receptions.

The Chapter was sponsored by New Forest Craft Lodge No. 319, which also meets at Lymington. Membership today is comprised of Masons from across the New Forest area. Several of its members are also members of the Lodge of Unity No 132 in Ringwood, which first met in a Lymington pub in 1764 before moving to Ringwood, so for them there is a feeling of being at the "original home" of their Mother Lodge.

The Chapter makes use of the beautifully and uniquely decorated Temple room upstairs at the Masonic Hall for its meetings on the fourth Thursday of October, November, January, February and March, with the Installation being in October.
